

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
FOR  
TECHNOLOGY LEADERSHIP AND SUPERVISION  
BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE PROGRAM  
BETWEEN**

**I. Program Scope**

The University of Houston (UH) College of Technology (COT) and San Jacinto Community College District have developed this articulation agreement for students who choose to complete one of the approved technical programs at any of the SJCCD campuses and transfer to UH COT to earn a Bachelor of Science in Technology Leadership and Supervision from the UH COT. The purpose of the agreement is to provide a smooth curriculum transition for students, allowing them to transfer from SJCCD to UH without loss of credits or duplication of coursework. The UH COT and SJCCD enter into this agreement as cooperating, equal partners who will maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

**II. Program Specifics**

The UH COT and SJCCD agree that any student who has completed an associate of applied science degree in one of the approved programs listed on the attached curriculum guide may transfer the specific course credits indicated on the curriculum guide toward a Bachelor of Science in Technology Leadership and Supervision at UH COT. SJCCD agrees to provide courses for its students that will transfer to UH as designated by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. SJCCD agrees to review the approved degree programs listed on the attached curriculum guide for core curriculum offerings and align the degree program core curriculum to that which is accepted by UH. SJCCD further agrees to provide courses that not only transfer to UH, but also count towards fulfilling 1000 and 2000 level course requirements in the Bachelor of Science in Technology Leadership and Supervision program in the COT. All courses designated as approved for college transfer under this agreement will be taught by faculty who meet Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) Commission on Colleges credential requirements. Table 1 contains the Bachelor degree graduation requirements for students who follow this articulation agreement.

**Table 1: B.S. in Technology Leadership and Supervision Graduation Requirements**

1. Complete an approved technical program from any SJCCD campus with the courses indicated on the attached curriculum guide and complete the coordinated program of study for the Bachelor of Science Degree in Technology Leadership and Supervision at UH. Students may transfer up to the maximum number of credit hours as stipulated by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to UH. The technical courses will be transferred as a block to be applied to the technical concentration in Technology Leadership and Supervision.
2. Courses in the area of technical concentration with a grade of “C” or better will be accepted for transfer to UH. A course in the area of technical concentration that was completed with a grade of less than “C” will not transfer and will have to be repeated.
3. Any grade earned in an academic course that is below “C-” (1.67 on a 4.0 GPA scale) is not transferable or applicable towards degree requirements.

4. Students may transfer up to the maximum number of lower-division credit hours from an accredited institution of higher education towards the Bachelor of Science degree as stipulated by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. Continuing Education course work cannot be transferred. A minimum of 123 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
5. Students must meet all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to UH, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges.
6. Students interested in transferring to UH should contact a UH program advisor early, before completing an admission application. To facilitate the evaluation of transcripts, students should bring a copy of this articulation agreement to all advising sessions. Upon completion of academic advising the student will receive a copy of the degree agreement.
7. When applying to UH, an official transcript from San Jacinto Community College District must be sent to UH's Office of Admissions. Students must request this transcript from the San Jacinto Community College District Registrar.

### III. Communications

The UH COT and SJCCD agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. Communication may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff at both institutions will communicate information about this agreement to students and prospective students.

The UH COT and SJCCD agree to the continual review of each respective program and to communicate annually any curriculum changes or policies, which affect this agreement. Both parties reserve the right to amend or revise by mutual consent and in writing this agreement or to change curriculum, whenever feasible.

### IV. Review of Agreement

SJCCD Vice Chancellor will designate individual(s) who will be responsible for all aspects of the articulation agreement at SJCCD. The UH COT, Information and Logistics Technology Department Chair will be responsible for all aspects of this articulation agreement at the University of Houston.


The UH COT and SJCCD agree to review this agreement, for possible revision and renewal, by the end of the three-year effective period. If this agreement is not renewed, students who have selected and designated this program prior to termination of the agreement, will be given three additional years, beyond the initial three, to be admitted to UH under the terms of this agreement.

This agreement is effective as of: August 1, 2007.

*Students who began approved technical programs at San Jacinto Community College District prior to the effective date may use this agreement.*

This agreement is effective beginning with the Fall 2007 semester and will remain in effect until further notice. If either party seeks to terminate this agreement, written notification should be provided to the other party at least 6 months prior to the start of the next academic semester.
